DAY – 1: Arrival in Tbilisi - Welcome to Georgia





DAY – 2: Explore the Heart of Georgia - Mtskheta & Tbilisi



After a delicious breakfast, begin your day with a scenic drive to **Mtskheta**, one of the oldest towns in Georgia and revered as the spiritual heart of the country. Here, you'll visit the stunning **Jvari Monastery**, perched atop a hill, offering breathtaking views of the surrounding landscapes. This iconic site is a symbol of Georgian church architecture and is tied to a legend of St. Nino, who is said to have established one of her three crosses here. As you stand at the monastery, you'll feel a deep connection to Georgia's rich history and religious heritage. The panoramic views of the confluence of the **Aragvi and Mtkvari rivers** below only add to the awe-inspiring atmosphere of the place.



Next, you'll continue your exploration with a visit to the **Svetitskhoveli Cathedral**, the first and most significant church in Georgia, where centuries of history and devotion are embodied within its walls. Known as the "**Life-Giving Pillar**," this cathedral is a UNESCO World Heritage site, and its breathtaking frescoes and intricate architecture showcase the spiritual depth of the country.

As you step inside, the air seems to hum with the reverence and historical significance that have made it a center of Georgian Christianity for over 1,500 years. You'll be transported back in time, immersing yourself in the sacred atmosphere that has drawn pilgrims for generations.

As you walk across the bridge, you'll be surrounded by the harmony of Tbilisi's old and new, creating an unforgettable visual experience.



A ride up the hill via cable car will bring you to the **Narikala Fortress**, where you'll be rewarded with panoramic views of Tbilisi below. The fortress, dating back to the 4th century, has withstood centuries of history, offering a glimpse into the strategic significance of this ancient hilltop stronghold. After taking in the spectacular sights, make your way down by foot, and continue to the famous sulfuric baths, a royal bath complex that dates back to the 17th century and remains one of the most famous spots in the Old Town. These iconic bathhouses, with their domed roofs and natural hot springs, have long been a central part of Tbilisi's culture and history, offering a soothing and rejuvenating experience for visitors.



As you stroll through the charming **Shardeni Street**, named after the French traveler Jean Chardin, you'll feel as if you've stepped into Paris, with its boutique shops, cozy cafes, and art galleries offering a delightful atmosphere. The vibrant energy of the street invites you to linger, making it the perfect place to unwind and take in the beauty of Tbilisi's old town. Your day will conclude with visits to the **Juma Mosque** on Botanical Street, the historic **Meydan Square**, and the sacred **Sioni Church**, home to one of Georgia's greatest relics – the **cross of St. Patriarchate**. After a full day of exploration, enjoy a delicious dinner at a local restaurant, where you can savor authentic Georgian flavors. With your senses filled and your heart content, it's time to rest and recharge, preparing for another exciting day of adventure tomorrow.



DAY – 3: Journey Through History and Natural Wonders



The third day of our journey unfolds with a scenic morning drive towards the **Ananuri Fortress**, a strikingly well-preserved castle perched on the shores of the **Zhinvali Reservoir**. Once a formidable defensive stronghold during the feudal era, Ananuri offers a glimpse into Georgia's rich history, surrounded by awe-inspiring landscapes. As you walk through its ancient walls, you'll feel the weight of centuries of history and the strategic importance this fortress once held. The panoramic views of the reservoir and surrounding mountains make it a perfect spot to pause and reflect on the beauty and history of this remarkable place.



Next, we make our way to **Gudauri**, a charming ski resort that captivates visitors regardless of the season. Nestled amidst the majestic **Caucasus Mountains**, Gudauri offers not only exhilarating winter sports but also breathtaking panoramic views.

A stop at the balcony dedicated to **the Treaty of Georgievsk** reveals a vantage point where history and nature converge in perfect harmony. From this elevated point, you can see the vast expanse of the mountains stretching endlessly into the horizon, offering a serene backdrop to the rich historical significance of the place. The air is crisp and fresh, further enhancing the feeling of being suspended in a landscape where time and nature coexist peacefully.



After a short drive, we arrive at the **Vedza Springs**, renowned for their unique sour waters and the calming tranquility of the surrounding area. This enchanting spot is a haven of natural beauty, where the gentle sounds of the water and the fresh, crisp air invite a deep sense of peace. The landscape here is nothing short of mesmerizing, with lush greenery, soft rolling hills, and the distant whispers of nature all around. The sour waters, thought to possess healing properties, flow serenely through the valley, adding an element of magic to the landscape. As you take in the breathtaking views, a sense of calm washes over you, allowing you to fully connect with the soothing rhythms of this hidden gem in the heart of Georgia.



Our journey then takes us to the **Trinity Church of Gergeti**, a stunning gem perched at an altitude of 2,170 meters, gracefully standing at the foot of the majestic **Mount Kazbek**. This 14th-century church, a masterpiece of medieval Georgian architecture, is the only cross-domed church of its kind in the entire region of Khevi. Its weathered stone walls tell tales of centuries past, offering a sacred and serene atmosphere that contrasts beautifully with the towering, snowcapped peaks surrounding it. As you ascend to the summit, you are rewarded with an awe-inspiring panoramic view—an expansive sea of rugged mountains and valleys stretching far into the horizon. The memories of the ancient fortress, the majestic peaks, and the quiet beauty of the church will remain with you, a reminder of the incredible journey through Georgia's most enchanting landscapes.

DAY – 4: A Wine-Lover's Dream in Kakheti



Today, we set off on a scenic drive to **Kakheti**, a stunning region renowned for its fertile vineyards and the production of some of Georgia's finest wines. As you enter this picturesque landscape, the lush, rolling hills covered in vines create a breathtaking backdrop for our exploration. From here, we continue our journey to **Tsinandali**, a quaint village that was once home to the illustrious **Chavchavadze family**. Here, you'll explore the family estate, where a labyrinth of exotic trees and beautiful gardens surround the historic home. The estate's serene atmosphere invites you to wander through its lush pathways, soaking in the vibrant colors and scents of the carefully cultivated landscape.

In the cellars, a unique collection of Georgian and European wines is carefully preserved, offering a taste of tradition in every bottle. The ancient wine-making techniques passed down through generations are evident in the richness of each wine, reflecting the deep history and culture of **Kakheti**'s winemaking heritage.



Our next stop takes us to **Batonis Tsikhe**, the fortress museum of King Erekle II, one of Georgia's most beloved rulers. This stronghold stands as a testament to the region's royal past, with its impressive architecture and fascinating history. As you explore the fortress, you'll uncover the stories of King Erekle II's reign, marked by his courage, wisdom, and vision for a united Georgia. Next, we head to the **Haghartsin Monastery**, located not far from Goshavank, set within a picturesque valley surrounded by towering trees. This monastery, dating back to the 10th century, is a marvel of Armenian architecture, with its grand domes and intricate designs.

The tranquil surroundings of the monastery create a spiritual ambiance, offering visitors a sense of timelessness as they walk among the historic structures. The peaceful environment and stunning natural beauty of Haghartsin make it a perfect place for quiet contemplation.



Next, we make our way to **Dilijan**, a charming resort town known for its vibrant arts and crafts scene, as well as its lush, green landscapes. 



The Matenadaran not only showcases the artistry of the manuscripts but also stands as a testament to the resilience and scholarly devotion of the Armenian people throughout the centuries.



Afterwards, we take a short drive to **Etchmiadzin**, often referred to as the religious center of Armenia. It is here that the adoption of Christianity in 301 AD marked Armenia as the first nation to officially embrace Christianity. You will visit the **Etchmiadzin Cathedral**, the oldest Christian temple in the world, and the seat of the Supreme Patriarch of the Catholicos of all Armenians.

This sacred site is home to an important religious relic—the **Holy Lance**, the spear believed to have pierced Christ's side. In 2000, Etchmiadzin Cathedral was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site for its profound historical and religious significance.



Your journey also includes a visit to the ruins of the **Zvartnots Temple**, a 7th-century masterpiece once considered a miracle of its time. Now a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the ruins of this architectural wonder offer a glimpse into Armenia's past and its remarkable achievements in religious and cultural history. The temple, originally built as a symbol of Armenia's early Christian heritage, was renowned for its innovative design, with circular colonnades and a grand central dome that once towered over the surrounding landscape. The site still exudes an air of majesty, with its views of the surrounding countryside and the distant **Mount Ararat** creating an aweinspiring setting.



DAY – 7: A Spiritual Journey Through Armenia's Sacred Monasteries



On Day 7, your adventure begins with a trip to **Ararat Province**, home to one of the holiest sites in Armenia— **Khor Virap Monastery**. 

After immersing yourself in the serenity of Geghard, the tour continues to **Garni Village**, where you will visit the **Garni Temple**, the only surviving example of **Hellenistic architecture** in the region. Standing proudly atop a hill with sweeping views of the surrounding countryside, this ancient pagan temple dedicated to the sun god Mihr dates back to the 1st century AD.

The **Garni Temple** is a marvel of classical Greek architectural style, with its imposing columns and elegant design providing a striking contrast to the surrounding Armenian landscapes.
